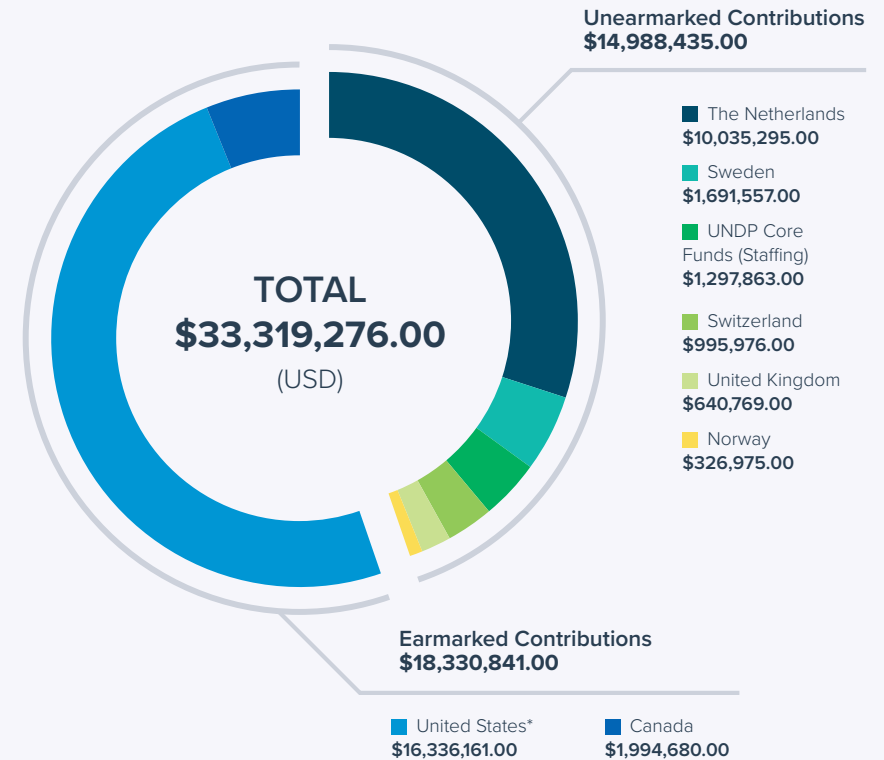


Global Programme Financial Information

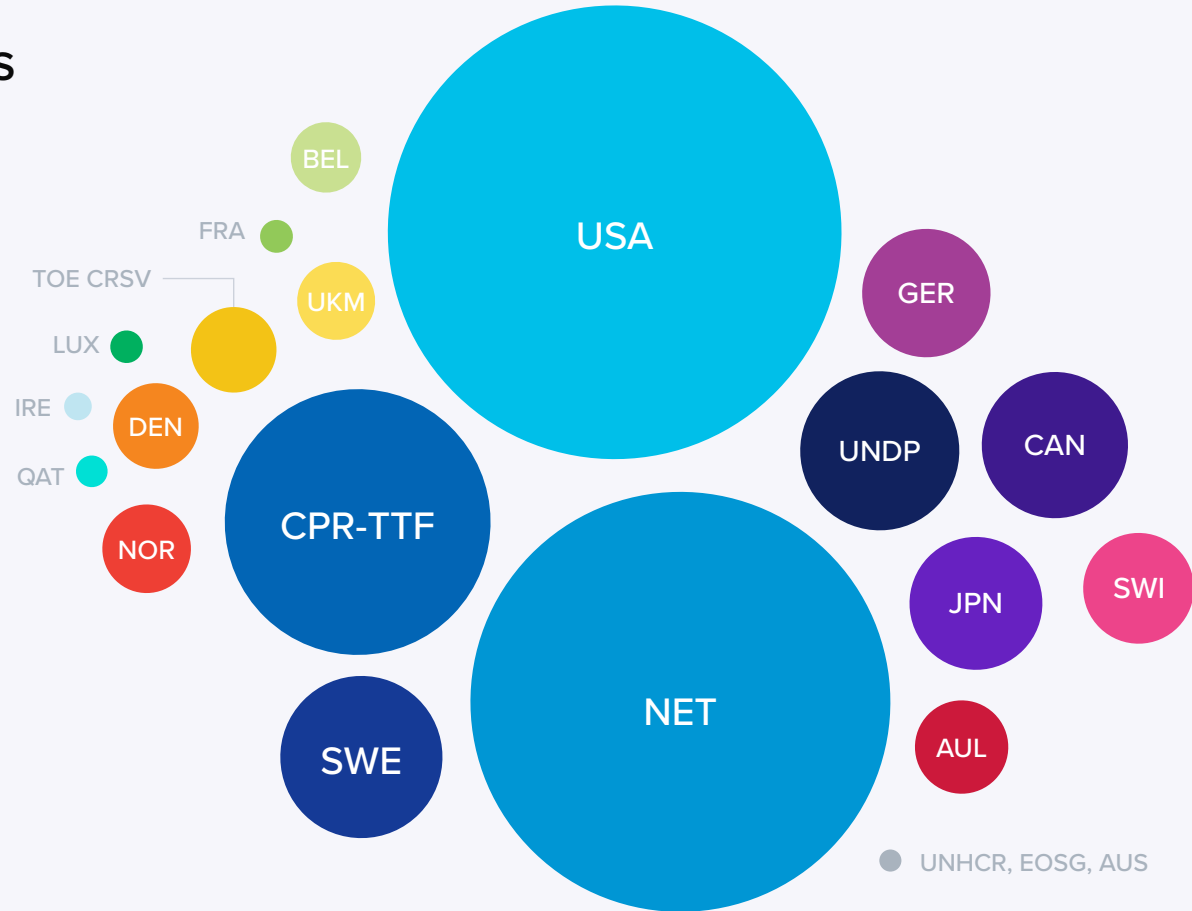

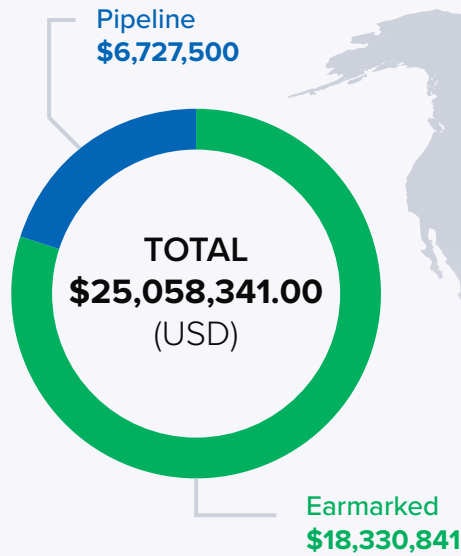
